Linn Petersen worked pretty much 24/7 for the three days of the show. Suzanne Shimatzki sorted and entered all the previous year show raffle tickets and mailed about 400 postcards and emailed 800+ notifications. Kudos and great thanks to all those who volunteered to work a shift/shifts working the doors, sales, raffle, exhibits, etc. We had 60 individuals register to work time slots at the show. This represents 46.49% of the memberships in the club. We thank you for your loyalty. Without you we would not have a club. Our hope for

next year is that all club members will make show participation a priority so that our percentage will increase to 100%!!

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Open Positions in the Club

In November we will hold club elections. At present, we have several positions that must be filled for the club to continue to function. They are:

PRESIDENT: *It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the Executive Board and of the Club. The president shall appoint a Field Trip Chairman, Refreshment Committee Chairman, Editor, Membership Secretary, Photographer, Historian/Archivist, Show Chairman, Open House Chairman, Nominating Committee with a Chair and such representatives and delegates as may be needed or any special Chairman as needed. The president shall also be responsible for making sure that the Statement Of Continued Existence required by Ohio Revised Code 1702.59, is timely filed when it comes due. The President shall also be responsible to make sure that all club activities are within the Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws of the club.*

VICE PRESIDENT: *It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to perform the duties of the President in the absence of the President. The Vice President shall, when so acting, have all the powers of the President and be subject to all the restrictions on the President in*

these By-Laws. The Vice President shall be the Program Chairman and shall be responsible for the arrangement of speakers, films, displays, and etc. for the night of the Club meeting.

SECRETARY: *The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Executive Board meetings and of the Club meetings and publish them in the Club bulletin for membership correction and/or approval. The Secretary shall carry on official Club correspondence. The Secretary shall retain in their possession one full year of secretarial reports, after which time the Secretary shall turn them over to the Historian for permanent record.*

TREASURER: Michelle Grigore has agreed to run for this position. She says this about her past experience: I served as director of TBG for 3 years and as director of the Bowling Green (BG) Parks and Recreation for 11 years. I'm now Director of Programming for Metroparks of the Toledo Area. In those positions, I had/have to handle annual budgets, purchase orders, accounts receivable, grants, donations, monthly expense reports, budget transfers and fundraising. In addition, I served for six years as Treasurer of the Oak Openings Region Conservancy- a local land trust. It was pretty simple accounting in an excel sheet, but did involve grant management and invoicing. I also served as the defacto CFO for Toledo Botanical Garden for a year after our finance manager left. That involved payroll, daily deposits and reconciliation, some Quick Book use, financial report creation, FICA and sales tax payments. As president of BG Kiwanis Club and BG Zonta club, I worked closely with the Treasurer on monthly reports and deposits and the Fundraising and Membership chairs on income. I've also been Secretary of the Black Swamp Arts Festival Committee and Fundraising Chair for both Kiwanis and Zonta clubs.

I tend to step up to do whatever job needs to be done and feel confident I can quickly learn the TG&RC reporting and tracking system. I'm pretty proficient with databases, worksheets and reporting software. One thing I would ask is for a second person to count cash with me at the Gem and Mineral Show to provide increased internal controls. It looked like that could be done easily by the person working the membership table, at least when that area isn't busy.

BOARD MEMBER (3 Year Term to Replace Harold Burleson). Harold Burleson has agreed to run for this position. He has held it for the past 3 years.

GROUP MODERATORS: *These individuals are responsible for opening the craft center for group meetings.*

LETTERS FROM THE BOARD

Due to the recent conflict between the Gemcrafter swap and the show work day, the following clarification letter, signed by all board members excepting Greg Feight, was sent by registered mail to Ms Bonnie Wheeler:

Given your concerns over the recent scheduling overlap between the Swap Meet and the Show Work Day, we thought it would be prudent to clarify the board's position on event scheduling. On March 18th, you approached the board with the suggestion that official swap meets be held in July and August. The relevant portion of the meeting minutes is included below:

Swap Meet Proposal - Bonnie Wheeler proposed in writing a "Beads & Jewelry Making Findings Swap Meet" in July on an annual basis beginning in 2017. Following discussion Tonia Wallace made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Greg Feight. Board passed the motion.

Bonnie Wheeler added a second Swap Meet related to rocks, slabs and cabs for late August. Following discussion the date was determined to be too close the annual club show. The Board recommended the Swap Meet should be held the first Saturday in August. Greg Feight moved the event should be moved to the first Saturday in August and it was seconded by Deb Hoffmaster. The Board passed the motion.

At that time, you requested use of the craft center, the surrounding grassy area and the adjacent parking lot. Deb Hoffmaster then contacted TBG and requested that those areas be made available for your use during the requested time frame. While we were happy to reserve space and inform the club members about the event, we cannot, and do not, prevent club members from scheduling events in other areas for overlapping times. It goes without saying that the same is true for TBG, with the additional caveat that, since the gardens are open to the public, individuals or groups may wander through at any time.

In the situation mentioned above, the garage was not reserved, and John had made arrangements to park farther away to avoid the reserved areas. As such, it is our opinion that the two events did not

The 2016 MWF convention meeting was held in South Bend, IN on the 19th and 20th of August, 2016. Most of the information is presented in the many packets from the differing groups of the Federation. Some highlights:

* the Federation decided to drop the used stamp program. With so many people reading books off their phones and other things, they feel that bookmarks are no longer needed.

* it was stressed that membership numbers should be reported to the MWF as early as possible in January because it helps the MWF to get this information to the American Federation in a timely manner AND it keeps the insurance rates down.

* many small clubs depend on the MWF for insurance. Much discussion centered on the cost of insurance and the potential for rate increases. Perhaps, after final membership numbers are known, there might be a discount for paying early.
